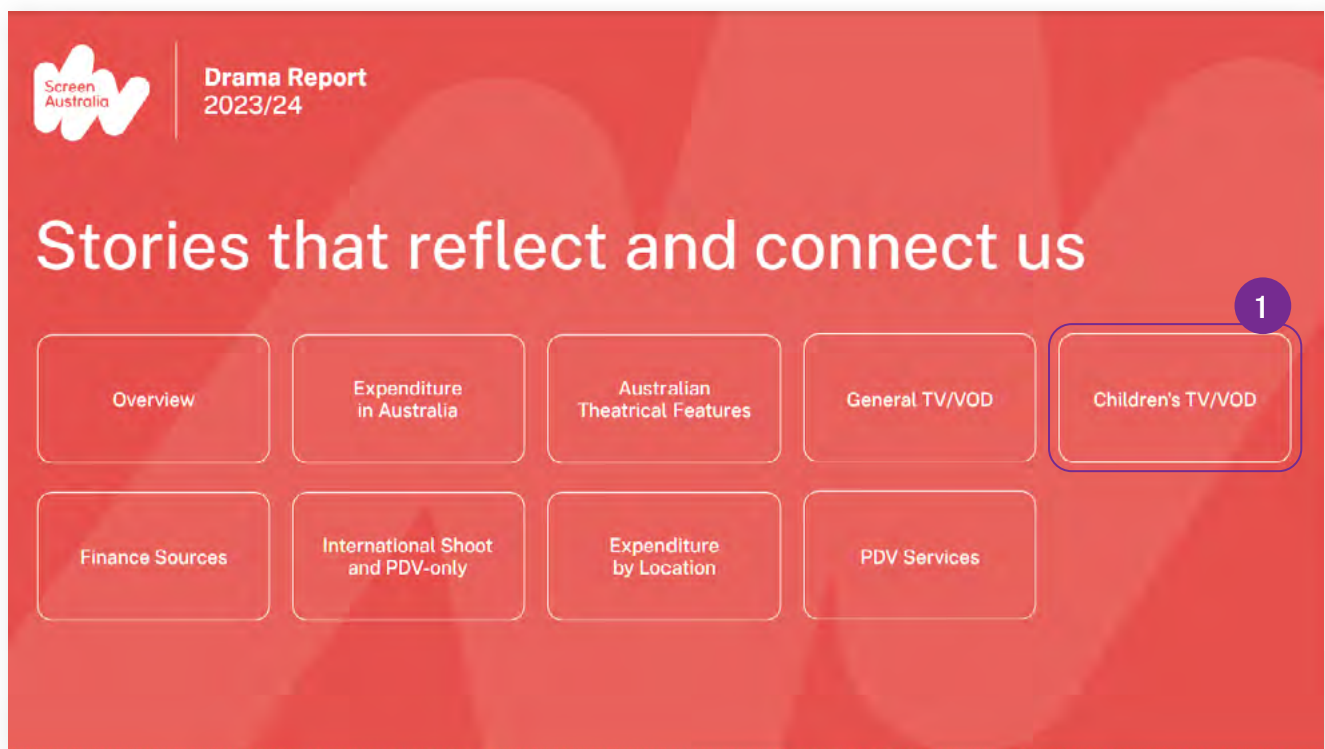


This guide explains how to navigate the Screen Australia Drama Report dashboards.

This streamlined approach offers a more engaging and accessible experience, enabling users to explore the results, see the data in action, and jump directly to specific sections or data points that are of interest.

Navigation



The Homepage

This page provides a navigation menu for the nine sections of the Drama Report dashboards – the image above shows the options available.

1. Homepage Navigation

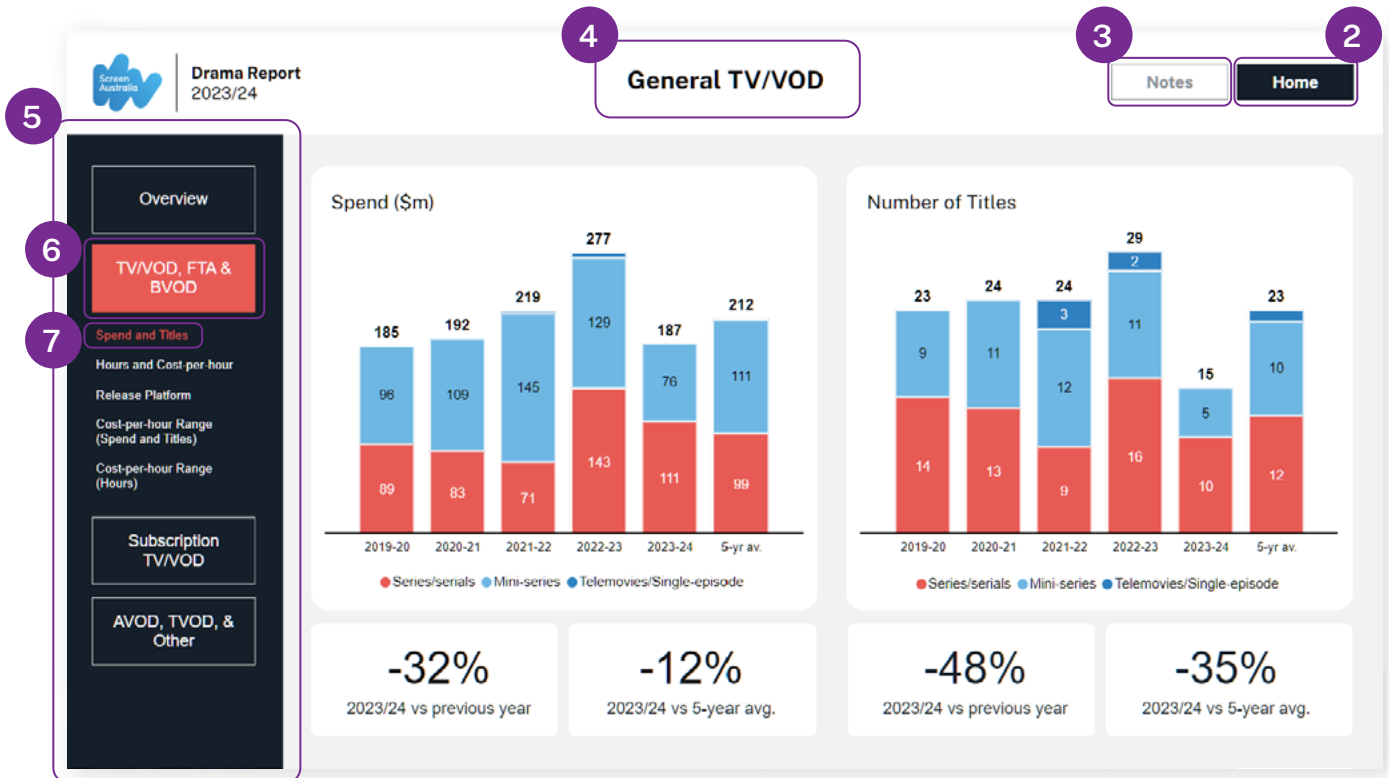
Clicking on any of the nine buttons will take you directly to that section of the report on the website, where you will find the relevant analysis and dashboard.

2. Home Button

You can navigate to the Homepage by clicking on the Home button, located in the top right corner of each page.

3. Notes

Clicking on the Notes button will take you to explanatory notes for that section. These notes include information on data collection methods or important definitions.



4. Section Title

This displays the title of the section you are currently viewing in the Drama Report.

5. Section Navigation Panel

On the left side of each page, you'll find a navigation panel with clickable buttons and links to sections and sub-sections. Use this panel to explore different charts within the section you are viewing.

6. Category Buttons

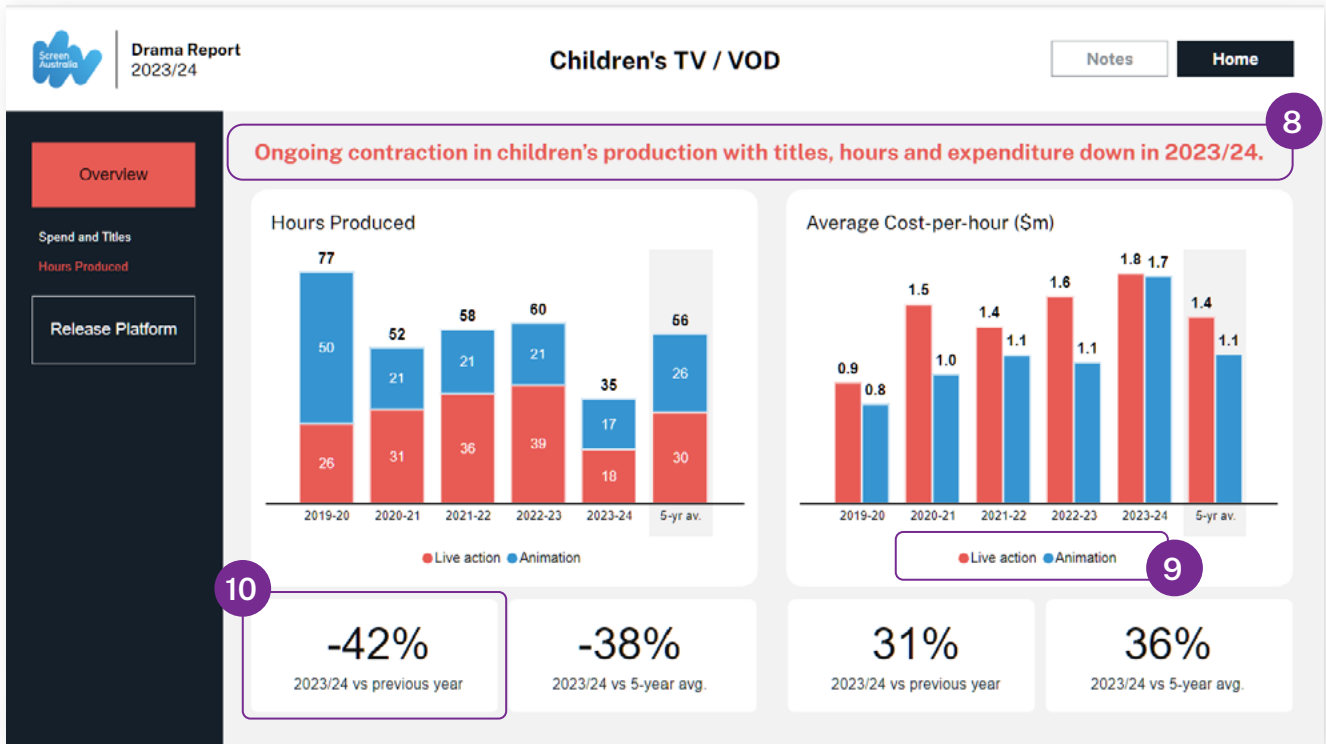
On the Navigation Panel, each button takes you to a different category within the section. The button highlighted in red indicates your current location.

7. Sub-category or Topic Links

Some sections have sub-categories or topics that you can navigate to by clicking the link. The text link to the sub-category or topic you are currently viewing will be highlighted in red in the navigation panel.

Interactive Charts

The illustration below gives you information on how to use the data dashboard charts to explore the range of data available on each page.



8. Key Insights

Many pages of the dashboard feature key insights, displayed above the data, that provide an overview of the section's most important finding(s).

9. Interactive Legend

For charts with multiple data series, you can click on the legend to view just one series at a time. The callout cards below the charts will display key metrics for the series you selected.

Tip: After you have finished exploring the data for a series that you selected, click on it again to de-select that series. This will ensure that the data displays properly for subsequent categories and sub-categories in that section.

10. Responsive Callout Cards

Most charts have key metric callout cards for % changes vs previous year, and vs 5-yr average: by default, these callout cards display the result for the total of all series in a chart. If you select a single series using the legend in the chart, the callout cards will display the metrics for the series you have selected.

For some data, results for % change may not be available on callout cards. Instead, you may see the following displayed:

- “ -- ” indicates you need to select a series in the legend to display results for that series.
- “ n/a ” indicates that a % change calculation was not possible or appropriate for the data series.
- “ n.p. ” indicates that results are not published for confidentiality reasons.

11. Rollover Datapoints

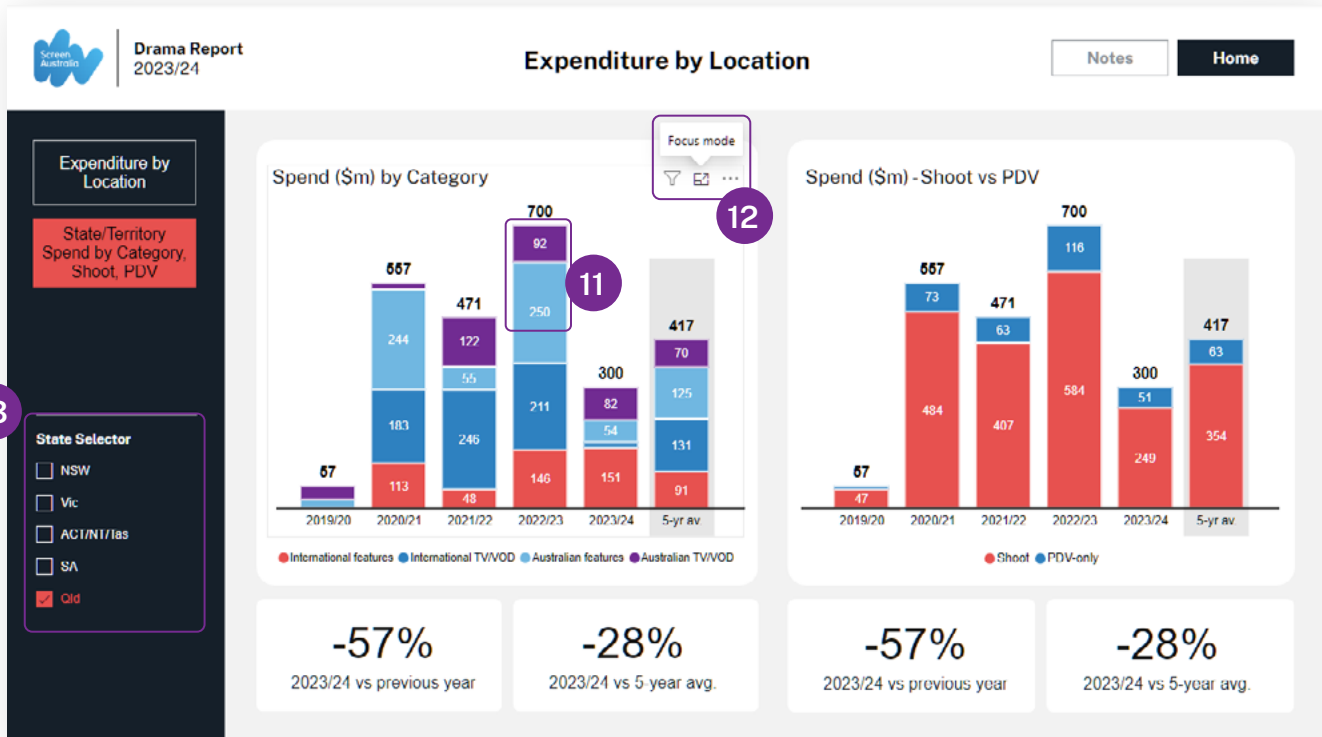
By hovering over a data point or segment in the chart, you can view more details for that specific data point.

12. Focus Mode

To view a chart in full-screen, hover over the chart area to reveal a Focus Mode icon at the top right of the chart. Clicking this icon will expand the chart to fill the entire dashboard window for a closer look.

13. Selector Navigation

On some pages, you can filter the data to focus on specific subsets, such as data from a single state. This can be done using the slicer/selector check boxes located in the bottom left corner of the navigation panel, where available.
